Teacher Guide to Student Interactive: Making Connections ...

Making connections is linking what the students read, to what they already know. This strategy helps students comprehend text, by activating their prior knowledge and making meaning of what they read. Debby Draper (2012) suggests questions that students may ask themselves as they read to help them make connections with the text.

Text-to-Self Connections: Encourage and model for students how to make connections that resonate with their lives and draw them closer to the text. Focus on events and ideas that reoccur across the text, rather than minor details such as individual words that are useful only on that one page (Miller, 2002).

If you have connections with a story you will often remember more, therefore you will have better comprehension skills. Use the Connections Worksheet to talk about the different kinds of connections people have to books they are reading. Text to Self: Connections that remind you of a life experience you have had.

It is, therefore, important that teachers encourage and help students to make connections with their prior knowledge. This helps make the new knowledge meaningful and memorable. A connection between a new concept and what has been taught before may seem obvious to an adult teacher, but perhaps not to a child whose frontal cortex is still developing.

Helping students make connections - The Science of Learning

Explain that they are going to play a game where the purpose is to connect with as many classmates as possible by finding something in common with them. Explain to the students how to play the game. They must walk around the classroom, trying to find someone who can answer 'yes' to one of the questions on the game card.

Two types of "deep connections" that we can make are text-media and text-to-world. (add those two types of connections to the anchor chart so that the completed version looks like the chart in the middle/high school resources page.)
